The only reason I am being notified is because of the NMOCD. I this continues to occur, I will be forced to issue an INC for each unreported release. A release that impacts the pasture is a 24 hour notification no matter the size. Even on old releases, you have to contact me prior to any surface disturbance.

With that said, I will concur with NMOCD approval.

NOTE: LPC Timing Stipulations are in effect - from **March 1st through June 15th**. Please plan remedial activities accordingly. Check for African Rue...treat (before it gets out of control).
