Yolanda, when you say you want to be involved in a future correspondence, does that mean Olivia Yu has already sent you what I have sent her? I can certainly send you the same information, but I don't want to just stuff your mailbox if you already have access to the images in the emails.

I now realize that I am late in getting this information to you, but I have been dealing with the problem daily and there was no spill. The fiberglass storage tank for the brine that is waiting to be injected into the disposal well, was struck by lightning during a night storm. The top of the tank was blown off and thrown a distance. The strike appears to have twisted the body of the tank and it opened up the seam at the bottom.

I do not really know how much was contained in the tank at the time, but it is regulated to just hold so much in height before the pump is activated to put it down the well. There are several photos that show the location when my pumper found what happened at the site. He arrived with an inspector with the NMOCD to perform a Bradenhead Test on the injection well and found the disposal fluid out of the tank and inside the lined containment pit. He called for a vacuum truck to dispose of the liquids, but I have not received the bill at this time. Today I was trying to get the new tank, which has been delivered, hooked back up. Additionally, I have been talking to the roustabout outfit about picking up the pea gravel that was in the disposal pit moved across the county road to the Lazy Ace Dirt Farm. We brought in (6) yards of new pea gravel and we have about that much to dispose of.

After notifying the NMOCD by phone regarding this incident, Danny called Maclaskey Oilfield Service and one of their vacuum trucks hauled 70 barrels of production water to a disposal facility. As the photo indicates, the released production water held in the fiberglass tank was contained in a lined pit. The pit liner kept the spill from spreading beyond the berm.
