

SYNOPSIS: On Wednesday February 21, 2018 at approximately 1223 hours I, Deputy Tovar responded to the intersection of Teague Switch and NM Hwy 18 about an oilfield theft.

ACTIONS UPON ARRIVAL: Upon arrival I contacted Jessie Pilcher who advised he noticed approximately 150 barrels of crude was missing from the tank battery. Pilcher stated he last checked the tanks on February 19, 2018 at 1300 hours and was gauged at 8ft 6 inches. Pilcher advised no oil had been authorized to be removed or taken from the tank batteries. He advised the tank battery was secured and has a seal with the number: 510451. Pilcher advised he checked the tank battery on this date and noticed the seal was missing and gauged the tank estimated approximately 150 barrels taken from the tank.

VICTIM: Cameron Oil and Gas company Roswell, New Mexico.

CONTACT PERSON: Jessie Pilcher pumper for Cameron Oil and gas base out of Roswell, New Mexico.

LOCATION/DRIVING DIRECTIONS: Cameron Oil and gas services
Steven "B" Federal
Unit C, Sec 20, T23S, R36E
Lea County New Mexico

Turn West on Teague Switch road off NM Hwy 18 and take the first lease road to the North. Driver approximately 5 miles into to the oil patch and turn south on lease road.

TIME FRAME: Pilcher advised he checked the tank battery on February 19, 2018 at approximately 1300 hours. Pilcher advised the seal was still secured and approximate gauge of 8ft 6 inches.

ITEMS TAKEN: Pilcher advised approximately 150 barrels of crude oil was taken from the tank battery. Total estimated value approximately \$ 7,130.00

DAMAGE: None reported now.

PHYSICAL EVIDENCE: Inv. Johnson arrived on scene to process for any evidence. See Inv. Johnson's supplemental for details.

SUSPECT: Unknown now.

CASE STATUS: Inactive due to the lack of evidence and leads.

Supplemental Narrative 02/23/2018 15:18:25 STEWART JOHNSON

On February 21st 2018 at approximately 1300 hours, I responded to an oilfield location south of Teague Switch Road in Lea County, New Mexico.

Upon arrival, I contacted Mike Pilcher, the company representative for Cameron Oilfield Service. Mike Pilcher indicated that on Monday, February 19th 2018 a tank battery which is located a mile south of Teague Switch Road was checked and measured. Mike Pilcher indicated that there was crude oil inside of the tank battery and that it was almost full. On February 21st 2018, the tank battery was

checked again and the crude oil that was inside of it was missing. Mike Pilcher indicated that the latch on the top of the tank battery was open and the valve had been tampered with.

Mike Pilcher indicated that the amount of crude oil taken from the tank battery was 115 United States Standard barrels. The approximate amount of oil taken was \$6600.00.

I noticed that there were tire impressions from a commercial motor vehicle that were next to the tank battery. I photographed the tire impressions and the scene. I advised Mike Pilcher that to further secure the oilfield location, that putting up a security camera would identify the suspects in the area.

On February 23rd 2018 at approximately 1200 hours, I responded to Deep Wells Road in Lea County, New Mexico following up on a lead of this case of oil theft.

Upon arrival, I located what looked to be oil on the roadway. I checked the roadway and noticed that the oil on the roadway was from a construction company chip sealing the roadway and the oil was covering the yellow divider line. I chipped some of the oil off and found yellow paint underneath it. This case is suspended pending further identification of suspects and new leads.

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
