
The Field Operations Division of New Mexico State Land Office requests approval to remove the above-ground markers on five plugged and abandoned wells on the Todd Lower San Andres Unit in accordance with 19.15.25.10 NMAC. The specific wells are identified in the table below. A 1 ft<sup>2</sup> surface marker will be placed with the same information as the above-ground markers (operator name, lease name and well number and location, including unit letter, section, township and range).
