Dear Mr. Blehm:

I was very glad to talk with you by telephone today and to learn that the plat we had submitted with Form C-101 dated October 8, 1951 to cover the proposed drilling of our subject well would meet the requirements of the Commission. As I promised you during our conversation, I am attaching hereto corrected Form C-101 in triplicate to cover this well inasmuch as the form originally submitted and which you now have did not carry the data on the required bond; also, at the time the form dated October 8 was filed, we did not have the name of the contractor and I have also added that to the corrected form.

As we discussed during our conversation, although our engineer, who is registered in Texas, can sign the plats on wildcat wells, we are, nevertheless, now arranging to have him qualify as a registered engineer in the State of New Mexico because we feel that would more nearly be in accordance with the intentions of the Commission.

Our telephone connection was apparently broken by the operator, so I want to take this opportunity to thank you for your favors of the past and to assure you that we at all times want and intend to comply fully with the wishes of the Commission. Anytime we fail to do so, we shall consider it a favor if you will call us collect--either the undersigned or Mr. Levi Shiplet here in Fort Worth, or Mr. T. P. Drew or Mr. Jack Cabaness at Midland.

I shall also make sure, as I promised over the 'phone, that Mr. G. R. Brown signs the extra copy of the C-101 on our State "BC" No. 1 which you were kind enough to make up for us and which you are forwarding to us as our approval.

Anytime we can be of any assistance to you, please let us know.
