Dear Mr. Smith:

Since June of 1958 we have been carrying as temporarily abandoned the Honolulu State No. 1 located in Unit I of Section 20, T-12-S, R-32-E, Lea County, New Mexico. No reports have been filed for this well since that time, although this Commission requires that Form C-103 indicating status and future plans for temporarily abandoned wells be filed at six month intervals.

Unless there are some definite plans for the future development of this well, this office sees no reason that it should not be permanently plugged. Please advise immediately as to your intentions regarding the well.
