We will squeeze present perforations in 7" casing from 8800' to 8848' with 75 sacks of cement.

We will deepen well to Devonian Section at approximately 11000' with Rotary Tools. If Devonian Section proves to be productive we will set 5" Liner from top of pay back to 8700' with a Brown Packer. Liner will be cemented from top to bottom. 7" casing is now set and cemented at 9349'.

We wish to start this work immediately.
