An inspection was made on October 17, 1968 of the J. M. Huber Corporation Lone Star Federal Well No. 1, located in Unit A of Section 30, Township 8 South, Range 36 East, and it was found to be in good shape for a well recently worked over. The pits were fenced and no oil was found puddled up around either the well site or battery location. Please bear in mind that a certain amount of inconvenience usually occurs during a workover or drilling program on any well, and a reasonable length of time must of necessity be allowed for final clean up.

The Commission has received information from the
State of New Mexico that the oil and gas
resources of the State are being depleted at an
unreasonable rate. The Commission is therefore
convinced that it is necessary to take
immediate action to conserve the oil and gas
resources of the State. The Commission is
therefore recommending that the State of New
Mexico should take the following steps:

1. The State should establish a conservation
fund to be used for the purpose of conserving
the oil and gas resources of the State.

2. The State should establish a conservation
board to be responsible for the management of
the conservation fund.

3. The State should establish a conservation
department to be responsible for the management
of the conservation board.

4. The State should establish a conservation
commission to be responsible for the management
of the conservation department.

5. The State should establish a conservation
office to be responsible for the management
of the conservation commission.
