DETAILS OF WORK

On September 5th, 1953, we ran 8-3/8" OD 32# J-55 Std Thread new National seamless casing to 3111' and cemented with 600 sacks bulk cement.

After allowing to stand cemented for 72 hours, we tested casing and cement, before and after drilling plug, with 1000 psig. Pressure was held for 30 min. with no drop and drilling was resumed.

Cementing was done by Halliburton Oil Well Cementing Co.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
