On August 29, 1953, we ran 13-3/8" OD 48# 8rd thread used casing to 234' and cemented with 175 sac cement, cement circulated when plug was 30 feet off bottom.

After allowing to stand cemented for 48 hours, we tested with 1000# pressure for 30 min., with no drop in pressure.

Cementing was done by Halliburton Oilwell Cementing Company.
