- 11-22-59 Core No. 1 3015' to 3039'. Reamed core hole to 7-7/8" to depth of 3019'. Set 5-1/2" OD 8 Rd. Trd. 14# J-55 casing at 3019'. and cemented with 150 sacks cement. Held 600 PSI for 24-hours.
- 11-23-59 Treated formation with 15,000# 20-40 sand and 5,000# 10-20-sand with 7,000 gallons oil. Maximum treating pressure 2300 PSI. Minimum treating pressure 2000 PSI. Average injection rate 31.2 barrels per minute.


