Dear Mr. Porter:

Reference is made to your letter dated October 21st regarding Form C-102, White-Geror State No. 3, H, S2, T14S, R31E. My reply has been delayed until now due to my being away from the office.

The referenced well was spudded January 22, 1955, and reported as completed August 18, 1955. On October 17, 1955, Form C-102 was filed on the basis of temporary abandonment.

Prior to the last well treatment, a swab test was made indicating reasonably good production with some salt water. A hydromite plug was placed in the bottom 4 feet of the well bore. After treatment the well flowed for 3 days and with the previous swab test, it appeared that production had been obtained. My wrong assumption and lack of storage (2 - 210 barrel tanks) prompted me to file for the allowable. Approximately one week later the well was producing 100% salt water.

With regard to the pertinent question in your letter - Form C-104 should not have been filed and may be considered presumptuous on my part.

In the future I will try to follow the regulations and shall thank you for not pressing the issue.
