Gentlemen:

Your application to re-enter, complete, and operate as a water disposal well the No. 1 Shell Federal on oil and gas lease New Mexico 0444628-A, located 330/N and 990/E sec. 35, T. 8 S., R. 30 E., N.M.P.M., Chaves County, New Mexico, by injecting waste waters into the San Andres formation through casing perforations at 3606-3680 feet, is hereby approved subject to the following:

- 1. This lease is non-producing and in as much as off-lease waters are to be disposed of in this facility, a Special Land Use Permit to operate this well as such must be secured from the Bureau of Land Management prior to disposing of any such waters. A Special Land Use Permit will authorize operation of this disposal facility regardless of the status of the oil and gas lease which will expire on September 30, 1973.
- Where applicable and required, right-of-way permits for pipe lines from other leases must be secured from the Bureau of Land Management prior to laying of any such gathering lines.
- 3. The usual Sundry Notice and Report (form 9-331 in quintuplicate) must be filed with this office prior to commencing any further workover treatment, suspension of operation, or change of status of this well. Submit a Subsequent Report of Re-entry for the work approved herein.
- 4. A monthly injection report (N.M.O.C.C. form C-120-A acceptable) must be submitted to this office in duplicate.

It is noted that this disposal well was approved by New Mexico I - V - I Commission order No. R-3999 on July 20, 1970.
