

11. OTHER INFORMATION - Cont'd

- C. Flora and Fauna: The vegetative cover is generally sparse and consists of mesquite, yucca, shinnery oak, sand sage and perennial native range grasses. Wildlife in the area is that typical of semi-arid desert land and includes coyotes, rabbits, rodents, reptiles, dove, quail, prairie chicken and antelope.
- D. Ponds and Streams: There are no rivers, streams, lakes or ponds in the area.
- E. Residence and Other Structures: The nearest occupied dwelling is a ranch house 5 miles south east of well site. Windmill 1½ miles east of well site.
- F. Archeological, Historical and Cultural Sites: None observed in the area.
- G. Land Use: Grazing and hunting in season.
- H. Surface Ownership: Well site and roads are on Federal lands.


