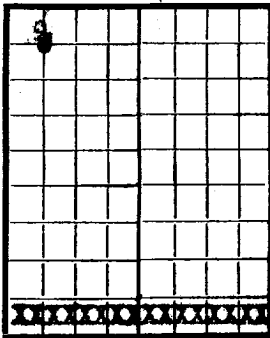

THE INFLUENZA VIRUS, AS IS WELL KNOWN, IS A VERY CONTAGIOUS AGENT, AND IT IS OF THE GREATEST IMPORTANCE TO KNOW THE EFFECTS OF THIS VIRUS ON THE RESPIRATORY TRACT.

THE PURPOSE OF THIS STUDY WAS TO DETERMINE THE EFFECT OF THE INFLUENZA VIRUS ON THE RESPIRATORY TRACT, AND TO DETERMINE THE EFFECT OF THE INFLUENZA VIRUS ON THE RESPIRATORY TRACT.

THE CONCLUSIONS OF THIS STUDY WERE AS FOLLOWS: THE INFLUENZA VIRUS PRODUCES A LOCAL INFLAMMATION OF THE RESPIRATORY TRACT, AND IT PRODUCES A SYSTEMIC INFLAMMATION OF THE RESPIRATORY TRACT.
