We propose to perforate the interval 11777 to 11800 with four jet shots per foot and wash casing perforations with 500 gallons mud acid, in an attempt to stimulate production from the Devonian Pay Section. Providing the above interval does not prove productive, it is planned to squeeze perforations and perforate and acidise at a higher level.
