

Lea State "R" (NCT-A) No. 1 - Anderson Ranch - Devonian

Drill stem test No. 1 - 9715-9815' Wolfcamp formation. Recovered 180' fluid, 120' gas cut mud and 60' slightly oil and gas cut mud cut 1% with oil. No water. Hydrostatic pressure 4865#, flowing pressure 140-185#, 30 minute bottom hole pressure 1520#. 2 hour test.

Drill stem test No. 2 - 4-1/4 hour test 9820-9962' Wolfcamp formation. Gas to surface in 3 minutes, 2,743,500 cubic feet. Mud to surface in 8 minutes, oil in 15 minutes. Flowed 373.60 barrels 42 gravity oil & 41.20 barrels sulphur water in 4 hours through 5/8" choke. 1st flowed 92.60 barrels oil & 10.20 barrels water; 2nd hour 94 barrels oil and 10.50 water; 3rd hour 93 barrels oil 10 water; 4th hr. 94 barrels oil and 10.50 water. Reversed out 47 barrels oil & 5 water. Recovered 180' sulphur water below circulating sub. 24 hour rate 2241.60 barrels oil and 247.20 barrels water. GOR 1224; hydrostatic pressure 5060#; flowing pressure 3275-3425#; 30 min. bottom hole pressure 3575#.

Drill stem test No. 3 - 5 hour test 13,391-13,410' Devonian formation. Opened tool with good blow air throughout test. Recovered 10,800' fluid, 1380' water blanket & 9450' clean oil. Recovered 60' clean oil no water below circ. sub. Hydrostatic pressure 6160#, flowing pressure 640-3255#; 30 min. build up pressure 4555#.

Drill stem test No. 4 - 6 hour test 13,391-13,420' Devonian formation. Tool opened with good blow of air. Gas to surface in 1 hour 20 min., too small to measure. Recovered 12,700' fluid, 1350' water blanket & 11,350' clean oil. Recovered 24' oil & 10' water slightly salty below circ. sub. Hydrostatic pressure 6160#; flowing pressure 640-3055#; 30 minute build up pressure 4555#.
