REPORT ON THE SHUTTING-IN OF ZAPATA WELL, PHILLIPS STATE "B" NO. 5

June 3, 1958

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The Zapata well, the Phillips State "B" No. 5, located in the NW/4 NE/4, Section 19, Township 17 South, Range 33 East, was shut-in for failure to submit drilling permit to the Hobbs, New Mexico, Oil Conservation Commission Office. Shut-in Notice was posted in doghouse at 5:30 P.M., June 3, 1958.

At 10:30 P.M., June 2, 1958, proper forms were submitted to Mr. Fischer and approved. Well was released to continue drilling.

Listed below is well status at shut-down:

- (1) Surface casing set to 365' - 8-5/8"
- (2) 120 sacks cement circulated behind casing
- (3) Well was down to 1345 feet
- (4) Date spudded, June 1, 1958

3:30 to 11:30 - stuck in hole, working drill pipe

From 5:30 P.M. when well was shut-in by O.C.C. until release at 10:30 P.M., drill pipe was stuck in hole.

Fifty barrels of oil was taken from lease tank battery and put in well to free pipe.
