To A.M.C., the State Conservation Commission of the State of New Mexico,  
Re: Mining Permit Request, New Mexico, April 15, 1929.

In view of the fact that you have been granted a permit to mine coal in the area of the San Juan River, and the fact that the same is located in the San Juan River basin, it is requested that you do not mine coal in the San Juan River basin, but rather in the Colorado River basin, where there is no mining activity at present. This is to prevent the possibility of causing damage to the San Juan River basin by the removal of large amounts of water from the Colorado River basin.

Believeable basis for this request is the fact that the San Juan River basin is much larger than the Colorado River basin.
