Please note that this order was signed on August 26, 1957 and ordered that within thirty days a proposed plugging program be filed for approval. Further, that within thirty days of approval of your proposed program that the well is to be plugged.

REPORT OF THE COMMISSION

1964

1. The Commission was organized in 1962 to study the problems of conversion and to make recommendations to the President and the Congress.

2. The Commission has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from the public.

3. The Commission has also conducted extensive research into the various aspects of conversion.
