9-5/8" casing was cemented in a 12 1/2" hole with 3160 sacks of cement; on bottom at depth of 4810'; on May 26, 1951. Plug was pumped down at 2:00 A.M.

Cement was allowed a set time of 55 hours before plug was tested and drilled. Test showed cement job to be O.K.
