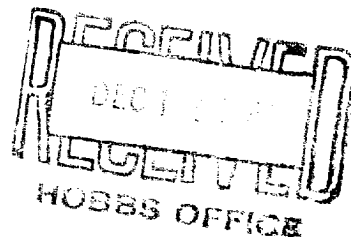

## DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

7" casing was set at 11,304.55 with 200 sac cement. After waiting 24 hours for cement to harden a temperature survey was run which indicated the top of the cement at 10020. The casing was tested with 1,000# for 30 minutes with no drop in the pressure. The casing was perforated at 10005-6 and the casing recemented with 300 sac cement. Another temperature survey was run which indicated the top of the cement at 8699. The casing was tested with 1,000# for 30 minutes with no drop in the pressure.
