## ***APPLICATION OF STEPHENS & JOHNSON OPERATING COMPANY TO EXPAND ITS WATERFLOOD PROJECT IN THE DENTON WOLFCAMP POOL IN LEA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO.***

### **ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER OF THE OIL CONSERVATION DIVISION**

Under the provisions of Division Order No. R-3001, Stephens & Johnson Operating Company has made application to the Division on October 23, 2000 for permission to expand its Denton North Wolfcamp Unit Waterflood Project in the Denton-Wolfcamp Pool in Lea County, New Mexico.

#### **THE DIVISION DIRECTOR FINDS THAT:**

- (1) The application has been filed in due form.
- (2) Satisfactory information has been provided that all offset operators have been duly notified of the application.
- (3) No objection has been received within the waiting period as prescribed by Rule 701(B).
- (4) The proposed injection well(s) are eligible for conversion to injection under the terms of Rule 701.
- (5) The proposed expansion of the above referenced waterflood project will not cause waste nor impair correlative rights.
- (6) The application should be approved.

#### **IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:**

The applicant, Stephens & Johnson Operating Company, be and the same is hereby authorized to inject water into the Wolfcamp formation at approximately 9170 feet to approximately 9300 feet through 2 3/8-inch internally plastic or fiberglass lined tubing set in a packer located within 100 feet of the uppermost injection perforations in the following described well(s) for purposes of secondary recovery to wit:
