## DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

Filled hole with oil, acidized with 1000 gals acid through jet gun by Powell from 4570 to 4585. Swabbed out spent acid through tubing. Well swabbed 25 bbls. oil per day before acidizing. Oil gradually exhausted after acidizing. Well made 1 1/3 bailers water with small amount of oil when deepening started from 4589. Ran rods in well and pumped well for 48 hrs. Made about a barrel per day of oil. On 9-5-41 well had been deepened to 4684 with no increase in oil or water.
