DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

T.D. 4137 Lime. With packer set at 3195', loaded hole with 145 bbls. water & introduced 1000 gal. Dowell XXW. Flushed tubing with 10 bbls. water to spot acid on pay. Let set 1 hour & reversed circulation & pumped 21 bbls. water down casing. Displacing acid out of well bore into pay. Swabbed water load & acid into pits 6 hours, no gauge. Next 24 hours swabbed approximately 1/3 bbl. fluid hourly, swabbing off bottom. Fluid was 50% oil, 50% water. Tubing was then pulled and preparations were started to plug and abandon well.
