DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

T.D. 4750 Lime. Placed gravel anchor from 4750' to 4737'. Ran in 660 qts. SNG from 4737' to 4376'. Gravel packed above shot to 3790' and filled hole with oil. Shot exploded 3:00 PM 1-4-39. Cleaned out with drill pipe, circulating oil during first 17 days, then switched over to bailer to finish cleaning out. March 4th cleaned out to bottom & bailed out 60 bbls. oil, no water. March 5th hole caved to 4735'. Cleaned out to bottom and March 6th bailed out 2 bbls. oil & $\frac{1}{2}$ bbl. water. March 7th and 8th bailed 6 gal. fluid hourly of which $\frac{2}{3}$ was oil and $\frac{1}{3}$ was water. March 9th preparations were started to deepen hole.
