At 1:00 a.m., April 13, 1945, thirty-six hours will have elapsed since setting 292' of 13-3/8" OD 48# New SS Casing and cemented with 250 sacks. At this time casing shut off will be tested as follows:

A pressure of 1000 # will be built up and held for 30 minutes, if casing shut off tests okeh, the cement plug will be drilled. A pressure of 1000# will be built up and held for thirty minutes and if this test, too, is okeh, drilling operations will be resumed.
