MISCELLANEOUS REPORTS ON WELLS

Reports on minor operations need not be signed and sworn to before a notary public, but such operations should be witnessed by an Oil and Gas Inspector if possible.

DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

7" O.D. 24# S.S. casing was cemented at 4026' with 325 sacks of cement, on March 8th, 1933. On March 15th the cement plug was drilled and bailing commenced for test off water shut off. However, the bailer was lost in the hole and it was not until March 17th that the hole was bailed dry and left undisturbed for 2 hours. At the expiration of that time the hole was still dry, which indicated an excellent water shut off.
