Dear Mr. Weaver:

Mr. Eric Engbrecht, Oil & Gas Inspector for the Commission, has made an inspection of the locations for your Mrs. Charlcia A. Taylor No. 2 in Unit J of Section 11 and Sunray Taylor No. 1 in Unit L of Section 12, T-18-S, R-38-E.

At the location for the Charlcia A. Taylor No. 2 he found that there was no description inscribed on the marker, the rat hole was caving in and the dead men holes had not been filled.

At the location for the Sunray-Taylor No. 1 he found that the dead men wires had not been cut, the oil was not covered and the cellar is filled with timber, whereas it should be filled with dirt.

Please advise this office when these things have been done so that a final inspection may be made.

Dear Mr. Hoover:

The following information was obtained from the records of the Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management, regarding the oil and gas interests of the State of New Mexico:

The State of New Mexico has a total area of 121,669 square miles, of which 10,000 square miles are covered by the public lands of the United States.

The public lands of the United States in New Mexico are managed by the Bureau of Land Management, Department of the Interior, and are subject to the same laws and regulations as the public lands of any other State.

The following is a list of the public lands of the United States in New Mexico, as of June 1, 1934:

1. 10,000 square miles

2. 10,000 square miles
