REPORT OF THE
COMMISSION ON THE ORGANIZATION OF THE MEDICAL PROFESSION

The Commission on the Organization of the Medical Profession, organized by the American Medical Association in 1912, has the honor to submit herewith its report. The Commission was organized to study the problems of the medical profession and to make recommendations for their solution. It has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from the public and from the medical profession. It has also conducted extensive research into the various problems connected with the organization of the medical profession. The Commission believes that the following recommendations will be of great benefit to the medical profession and to the public.

1. The Commission recommends that the American Medical Association be reorganized so that it will be able to represent the entire medical profession. At present, the American Medical Association represents only a small portion of the medical profession. It is necessary that the American Medical Association be reorganized so that it will be able to represent the entire medical profession.
