NOTICE OF TEST OF WATER SHUT-OFF

Notice must be given to the State Geologist or to the proper Oil and Gas Inspector at least five days before the test. It is desirable that a representative of the Department of the State Geologist witness the water shut-off before drilling into the productive sand whenever possible.

If changes in the proposed plan are considered advisable, a copy of this notice showing such changes will be returned to sender. Submit this notice in duplicate.

You are hereby notified that we intend to test the shut-off of water in Boone Hardin
Well No. 1 in SW Corner of NE 1/4 of Sec. 19, T. 13S, R. 38E,
N. M. P. M., Hobbs Oil Field Lea County,
on Sept 1st 1930. 7" OD 24 lb. casing was XXXXXX in Lime
formation at a depth of 3925' feet on August 28th, 1930 19
300 sacks of El Toro Oil Well cement were used.

The method used in placing the cement was as follows:

Halliburton patented process

Fluid level will be bailed to a depth of 2500' feet and left undisturbed for at least 12 hours before your inspection.
