I am advised by Mr. F. J. Vesely, State Oil and Gas Inspector that he has received your Notice of Intention to Drill New Well for the Moon Well No. 1, in NW 1/4 of Sec. 28, T. 18 S., R. 38 E.

As I believe you know the regulations of the State Geologist require the submission and approval of a bond assuring compliance with State laws, rules and regulations. This should be a Surety Company Bond in the amount of \$5,000.00 for one well.

I am not familiar with the business arrangements for this well, but have the impression that The Continental Oil Company may be involved. Possibly the well could come under the general bond of The Continental Oil Company. I believe this would be satisfactory to this office.
