State A-29 Well # 2 Was Treated with 1000 Gallons of Acid by Dowell Chemical Co. on 2-15-34 Formation Treated from 4076 to 4184, with 100 bbls of oil load behind acid.

Potential before Treating 2696 Bbls, Allowance 98 bbls, G<sup>a</sup>s-Oil Ratio 1650-1. After Treating well Tested thru tubing at rate of 3528 Oil 2,400,000 cu. ft. Gas open flow. Acct of being a packer well placed on curve and given a potential of 4650 oil Allowance effective March 1st, 137 bbls daily. Gas-Oil Ratio 1115-1.
