MINUTE BOOK OF THE BOARD OF LAND MANAGEMENT

The Board of Land Management was organized on January 1, 1933, and has since that time been engaged in the study and consideration of the various questions relating to the management of the public lands of the United States. The Board has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from the public. It has also conducted extensive research into the various problems connected with the management of the public lands.

The Board has found that the management of the public lands is a complex task, requiring the cooperation of many different agencies and departments of the Government. It has therefore recommended that a system be established by which the various agencies and departments would be brought together in a single body, the Board of Land Management, to coordinate their efforts and to make decisions on the management of the public lands.

The Board has also found that the public has a right to be heard in the management of the public lands. It has therefore recommended that a system be established by which the public could be heard in the management of the public lands. This system would consist of public hearings, public information campaigns, and the establishment of a public advisory committee.

The Board has also found that the management of the public lands is a task that requires the attention of the highest levels of the Government. It has therefore recommended that the management of the public lands be placed under the direct supervision of the President of the United States.

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
