### DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

After running and cementing 12-1/2 inch casing with 175 sac at 247 feet, obtaining circulation in cellar with this amount of cement, well was shut down for cement to set around pipe. Tools started up and went in hole and drilled plug on May 18, 1934. Then bailed hole dry and left same open for a 12 hour period, after which hole tested dry and drilling operations were resumed.
