## 11. OTHER INFORMATION (continued):

- C. Flora and Fauna: The vegetative cover is generally sparse and consists of mesquite, yucca, shinnery oak, sandsage and perennial native range grasses. Wildlife in the area is that typical of semi-arid desert land and includes coyotes, rabbits, rodents, reptiles, dove, quail and an occasional antelope.
- D. <u>Ponds and Streams</u>: There are no rivers, streams, lakes or ponds in the area.
- E. Residences and Other Structures: The nearest occupied dwelling is a pumper's house 4 miles northwest of the wellsite. The nearest water well is a windmill 2 miles west.
- F. Archeological, Historical and Cultural Sites: None observed in the area.
- G. Land Use: Grazing and hunting in season.
- H. Surface Ownership: Wellsite and all roads are on Federal Surface.
