

10. PLANS FOR RESTORATION OF THE SURFACE:

- A. After completion of drilling and/or completion operations all equipment and other material not needed for operations will be removed. Pits will be filled and location cleaned of all trash and junk to leave the wellsite in an aesthetically pleasing condition as possible.
- B. Any unguarded pits containing fluids will be fenced until they are filled.
- C. After abandonment of the well, surface restoration will be in accordance with the agreement with the surface owner. Pits will be filled and location will be cleaned. The pit area, well pad, and all unneeded access roads will be ripped to promote revegetation. Rehabilitation should be accomplished within 90 days after abandonment.

11. OTHER INFORMATION:

- A. Topography: Arid desert with elevation of approximately 3700'.
- B. Soil: Soil is a deep fine sand underlain by caliche.
- C. Flora and Fauna: The vegetative cover is generally sparse and consists of mesquite.
- D. Ponds and Streams: There are no rivers, streams, lakes or ponds in the area.
- E. Residences and Other Structures: None in the area.
- F. Archeological, Historical and Cultural Sites: None observed in the area.
- G. Land Use: Grazing.
- H. Surface Ownership: Snyder Ranch (Mrs. Virgil Linam)
