Dear Mr. Sexton:

With reference to the captioned and Mr. Don Shackelford's letter of January 27, 1989, please be advised that during the six month period between January 1, 1989 and June 30, 1989, Woodbine Petroleum, Inc., as operator of the captioned well, produced 23,295 barrels of oil against an allowable of 25,702 barrels of oil, resulting in an underproduction figure of 2,407 barrels of oil.

Insomuch as the overproduction to be made up during this six month time period was 1,567 barrels of oil, this letter will serve as confirmation that the 1,567 barrels of overproduction has been neutralized based upon Woodbine's production of the captioned well below the allowable, during the allotted time frame, in compliance with the Conservation Division's requirements.
