Dear Mr. Shachelford:

A sundry notice was submitted and approved by the BLM on August 17, 1992, showing that the drilling pit was still in place, but had been cut and was dry.

Woodbine Petroleum, Inc. requested that they be allowed to leave the pit for use in drilling a well adjacent to this location. The information we have available indicates that permission was granted to leave the pit for a period not to exceed two years.

To date, we do not have a record of any well being permitted or drilled which would make use of the pit.

An inspection of the location shows that the drilling pit is partially broke but not levelled.

However, water is being discharged into a netted and fenced pit, approximately 100 X 60 feet, on location.

Division Order R-3221, effective January 1, 1969, limits the disposal of produced water into unlined pits to no more than 1 barrel of water per day for each developed $4\emptyset$ acre tract. We request that you comply with the provisions of this order.

To insure compliance, we will make another inspection of the location in the near future.
