SURFACE USE PLAN

Anadarko Petroleum Corporation Federal "AW" #1 380' FSL & 990' FEL, Sec. 26-T19S-R32E Lea County, New Mexico NM-12412

This plan is submitted with Application to Drill on the above described well. The minerals are federal and the surface is leased for grazing (see below for surface lessee). The purpose of this plan is to describe the location, proposed construction activities and operations plans, magnitude of necessary surface disturbance and procedures to be followed in rehabilitating the surface after completion of the operation so that complete appraisal can be made of the environmental effects associated with the operation.

- 1. EXISTING ROADS Exhibit "E" is a portion of a U.S.G.S. topographic map showing the location of the proposed well as staked.
 - Directions to the well are as follows:
 From the junction of U.S. 180/176, 24
 miles east of Carlsbad, go north and
 east 3.7 miles on Hwy. 176, then go 6.1
 miles north on lease road, then east 2.2
 miles, then south 1.4 miles, then east
 0.9 mile to the northwest corner of Sec.
 26. Proceed east for 0.9 mile then turn
 south for 0.9 mile to wellsite.
- 2. PLANNED ACCESS ROAD An access road will extend East/
 Southeast approximately 70' to an
 existing lease road. This access
 road will be constructed according
 to BLM standards. Approximately
 700' of jeep trail will be improved
 to replace a section of road being
 incorporated into our pad. The
 rancher, Mr. Kenny Smith, was contacted and agreed to this road
 change.
- 3. LOCATION OF EXISTING WELLS IN AREA See Exhibit "F".
- 4. LOCATION OF PROPOSED FACILITIES Location of proposed well site and tank battery is shown on Exhibit "G". The battery will be located on proposed well pad. No additional surface disturbance will be necessary.
- 5. WATER SUPPLY No available surface or sub-surface fresh water exists in the vicinity of the proposed well. Drilling water will be transported or pumped to the drill site from the nearest commercial source.

- 6. SOURCE OF CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL Caliche for surfacing access road & pad will be obtained from an existing pit location in the NE/4 SE/4 of Sec. 15, or in another BLM approved site.
- 7. HANDLING WASTE DISPOSAL
 - a) Drill cuttings disposed into drilling pits.
 - b) Drill fluids allowed to evaporate in drill pits until pits dry.
 - c) Produced water during testing drill pits.
 - d) Produced oil during testing storage tank until sold.
 - e) Current laws and regulations pertaining to disposal of human waste will be observed.
 - f) Reserve pit will be plastic lined.
 - g) Waste paper, garbage & junk will be disposed of into a special container on location. All waste material will be regularly removed to an approved landfill.
 - h) All trash and debris will be buried or removed from well site within 30 days after drilling and/or completion operations are finished.
- 8. ANCILLARY FACILITIES None.
- 9. PLANS FOR RESTORATION OF SURFACE
 - a) After completion of drilling and/or completion of operations, all equipment & other material not needed for operations will be removed. Pits will be filled and location cleaned of trash and junk to leave well in as aesthetically pleasing a condition as possible.
 - b) Any unguarded pits containing fluids will be fenced until backfilled.
 - c) After abandonment of well, surface restoration will be in accordance with the Bureau of Land Management Surface Requirements.
