

A. General Plan

The lines of action to be followed for protection of the public from hazardous gas situations are as follows:

1. When the Cross Timbers approved supervisor (Drilling Foreman, Toolpusher, Driller) determine the hydrogen sulfide gas cannot be limited to the well location, and the public should be involved, he will activate these steps.
2. Cross Timbers approved supervisor or designee will notify the appropriate local government agency that a hazardous condition exists and evacuation needs to be implemented.
3. Cross Timbers approved supervisor will mobilize safety personnel that have been trained in the use of hydrogen sulfide detection equipment, SCBA, rescue, first aid and artificial resuscitation.
4. Law enforcement personnel (State Police, Local Police Department, Fire Department and Sheriff's Department) will be called to aid in setting up and maintaining road blocks. They will also aid in evacuation of the public if necessary.

NOTE: Law enforcement personnel will not be asked to come into a contaminated area. Their assistance will be limited to uncontaminated areas. Radio communications will be set up and maintained with them.

5. After the discharge of gas has been controlled, Cross Timbers contract safety personnel will determine when the area is safe for re-entry.
6. Also see Emergency Reaction Plan.
