DETAILS OF WORK

Propose drilling with rotary tools to top of salt at approximately 1450'; then run 8-3/8" casing and cement with 50 sacks. Then drill with Cable Tools to prospective pay zone in Seven Fm. at 3550'. If commercial oil or gas is encountered will run 7" casing to top of pay and cement with 100 sacks of cement. Will furnish sample description from just above base of salt to bottom of hole.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
