DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

10 3/4" Lapweld casing was set at 251' and cemented with 200 sacks of common cement. The well was allowed to stand undisturbed for 48 hours. The cement plug was then drilled and the hole bailed dry. After allowing the well to stand undisturbed for 1 hour the bailer was again run to ascertain the presence of water. No water was present. Drilling was resumed 4/27/38.
