REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL TO PROVIDE A
RESEARCH AND ANALYSIS OF THE
ECONOMIC IMPACT OF THE
PROPOSED HIGHWAY PROJECT

The purpose of this Request for Proposal is to solicit proposals from qualified firms to provide a research and analysis of the economic impact of the proposed highway project.

The project is located in the State of California, and the analysis should include a detailed description of the project, the area of study, and the methods to be used in the analysis. The analysis should also include a discussion of the potential economic impacts of the project, both positive and negative, and a recommendation of the best course of action.

The analysis should be completed within a period of 90 days from the date of the award of the contract. The analysis should be submitted in the form of a written report, and the firm should also provide a presentation of the findings to the project manager.

The firm should be a duly licensed professional engineering or architectural firm, or a firm with equivalent qualifications. The firm should also have a minimum of five years of experience in the field of economic impact analysis.

The firm should submit a proposal in the form of a written report, and the proposal should include a detailed description of the project, the area of study, and the methods to be used in the analysis. The proposal should also include a discussion of the potential economic impacts of the project, both positive and negative, and a recommendation of the best course of action.

The firm should submit the proposal to the project manager, and the project manager will select the firm to provide the analysis. The firm should be awarded the contract within 30 days of the selection.

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
