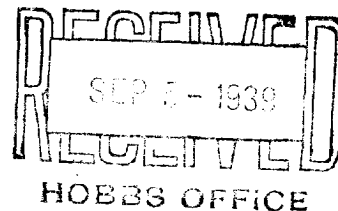

FULL DETAILS OF PROPOSED PLAN OF WORK

FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS IN THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COMMISSION

The above mentioned six producing oil wells are all located in Section 26-173-35E, as indicated on the attached plat. These wells can all be efficiently produced into one central tank battery, provided an exception will be made to the Oil Conservation Commission ruling against flowing more than five wells into one central tank battery. Unless this exception is granted, it will be necessary to set an additional separator and two additional stock tanks for one well, which involves a considerable expenditure. The aforementioned six wells flow into what is known as #7 battery, consisting of four 300-bbl. welded steel tanks.

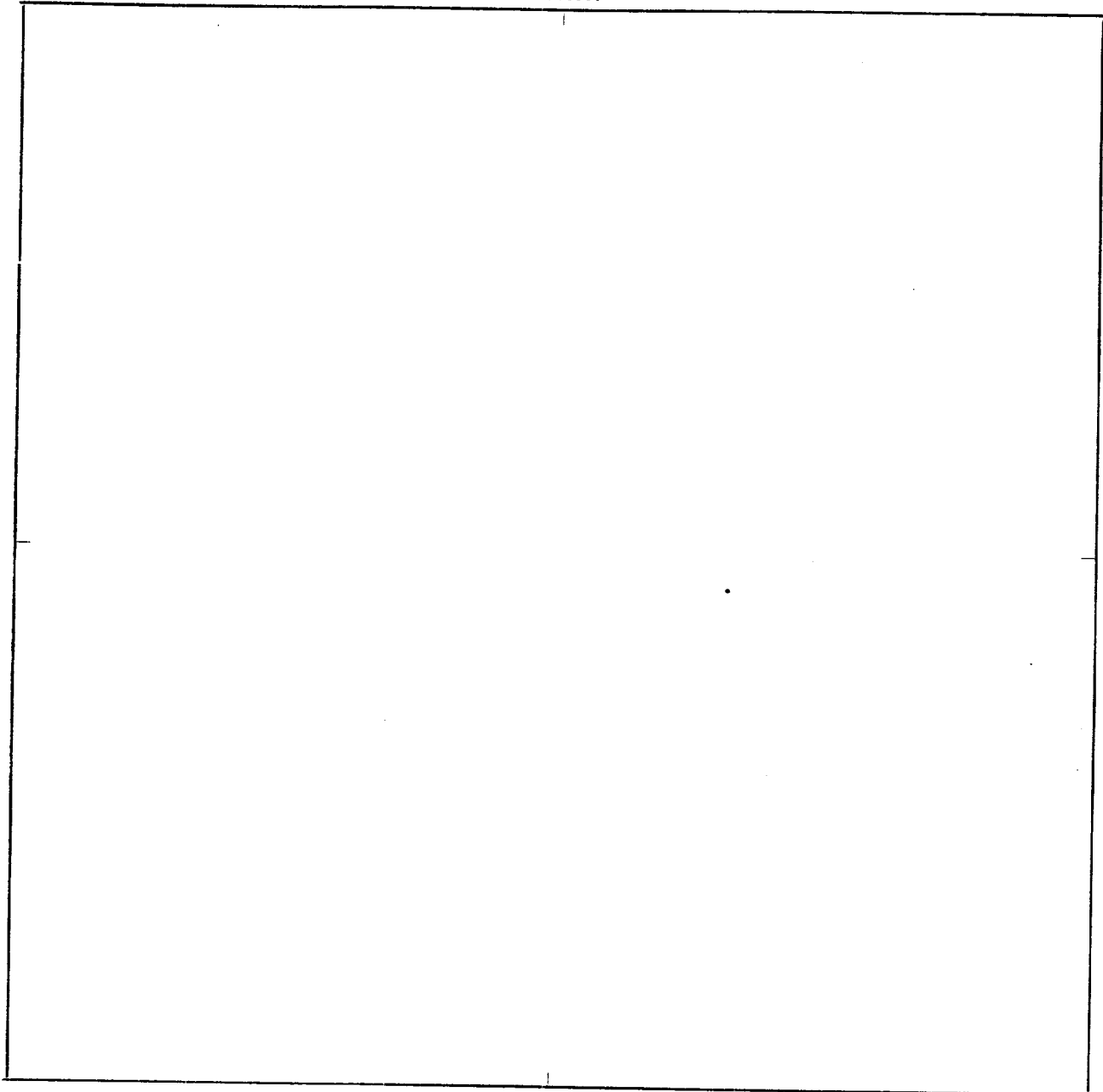
