Reference is made to your letter dated June 9, 1960, concerning the present status of our State 4-27 well No. 7 located in Section 27, T-17S, R-35E, Lea County, New Mexico.

Submitted herewith is Form C-103 indicating the present status of State 4-27 No. 7. As you will note, there has been no change in mechanical condition since April 28, 1958.

Evaluation to date indicates State 4-27 No. 7 to be of no immediate value. However, we do feel that this well may be of value at some later date, possibly in a secondary recovery program. State 4-27 No. 7 is located in an area under constant surveillance and no hazard will be created by deferring abandonment.

Based on this evidence, Standard Oil Company of Texas respectfully requests Oil Conservation Commission approval permitting temporary abandonment of State 4-27 No. 7.
