DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

T.D. 4700 Lime. Loaded annular space above packer set at 4083' with 135 bbls. oil & introduced 4000 gal. Dowell XGF-6. Flushed tubing with 115 bbls. oil. Rigged up and swabbed 16 hours thru tubing, recovered 60 bbls. oil load & acid. Pulled tubing and swabbed thru casing 15 hours, recovered 85 bbls. oil load and acid. Measured up and found 40' savings in hole. Cleaned out to bottom with bailer. Next 66 hours bailed out 172 bbls. oil load, acid & fresh oil. At end of 66 hours was bailing approximately 3 gal. oil hourly. Well was then shut in to determine rate oil was coming into hole. On bailing test found 3 gal. hourly to be maximum income. Well was then shut in to prepare to plug and abandon.
