COMMISSION ON ASSASSINATIONS

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REPORT OF THE COMMISSION

The Commission on Assassinations was organized on January 1, 1964, by the President of the United States, John F. Kennedy. The Commission was charged with the task of investigating the assassination of President Kennedy and the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy. The Commission's report is being submitted to the President of the United States, Lyndon B. Johnson, for his review and approval.

Findings of the Commission
