DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

T. D. 4652. Line. Treated pay formation from 4100' 9" to T. D. with 1000 gallons Dowell "XX". Immediately after treating, started swabbing. Swabbed 208 bbls. oil, Oil load & acid in 12 hours, swabbing to 4000'. Well then started flowing & flowed 68 bbls. fresh oil, 0 water during next four hours with flowing pressure of 75# on casing during first hour & 200# throughout next three hours. June 12th well flowed 48 bbls. oil, 0 water in 4 hours & was shut in to pressure up. June 13th well flowed 119 bbls. oil, 0 water in 7 hours. Gas measured 343,000 cu. ft. daily. Well shut in June 13th to prepare for another acid treatment.
