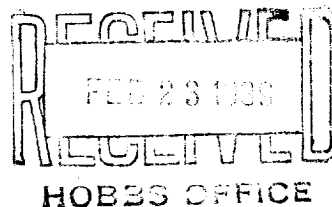

THEORY OF THE EARTH AND ITS HISTORY

The theory of the earth and its history is a branch of geology which deals with the origin and development of the earth and its various parts. It is a science which seeks to explain the processes which have shaped the earth and its features, and to determine the sequence of events which have taken place since the earth was first formed.

The theory of the earth and its history is based on the study of the earth's rocks and fossils. By examining the layers of rocks and the remains of plants and animals which they contain, geologists can determine the order in which they were deposited, and the conditions under which they were formed. This is done by comparing the rocks and fossils of different localities, and by studying the changes which have taken place in the earth's crust over time.

The theory of the earth and its history is also based on the study of the earth's physical features. By examining the mountains, valleys, rivers, and oceans, geologists can determine the processes which have shaped them, and the sequence of events which have taken place since they were first formed. This is done by comparing the features of different localities, and by studying the changes which have taken place in the earth's crust over time.

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
